



## **Webinar Series Strategy**

The NAP Global Network will launch its webinar series in 2017.

### **Objectives**

Each webinar in the series will address one or more of the following objectives:

1. To provide opportunities for continuous peer learning and exchange around key aspects that countries are addressing in their NAP processes
2. To promote resources and lessons emerging from the NAP Global Network to a broader audience

### **Strategic Entry Points for Webinars**

- A. Launch of a thematic publication / promotion of the Network's technical thematic work
- B. Building on results of a TTF, addressing a specific session or topic covered, country experiences of particular interest, and/or participant reflections on lessons from participation

### **General Format**

Webinars will:

- Have a length of 60-90 minutes (preferably 60 min, tbc depending on individual plan developed by lead for each webinar)
- Be moderated by the Network coordinator when possible
- Have technical support provided by the Network Media and Communications Officer or a substitute, as needed
- Include a brief introduction to the Network and webinar series, possibly using the Network's introductory video, and make reference to previous and upcoming webinars to convey the sustained approach to learning in the Network
- Include interventions by Network participants based on their country experiences, and/or expert resource persons, as appropriate
- Be scheduled at varying times to accommodate live participation by participants in a range of time zones. Webinars may also take place in different languages as appropriate.
- Be recorded for playback to a wider audience, and featured on the Network website.
- Be promoted to all participants as well as more broadly via Climate-L and via other communications channels in the lead-up to the webinar.
- Close with a reminder of upcoming webinars in the series

### **Platform for webinars**

GoToWebinar has been selected as the platform for Network webinars given that it is accessible to all current Network Management Team members.

### **Schedule of Upcoming Webinars**
