



## NAP Global Network Management Team Minutes

November 22, 2017

### 1. Secretariat staffing update

- Kaitlyn Finner has been placed on fulltime medical leave
- Christian Ledwell has been asked to step in as the Network coordinator

### 2. Debrief on COP 23

- Side events the NAP Global Network participated in

- **Launch of Fiji's National Adaptation Plan Framework**

- Co-hosted by the Government of Fiji and the NAP Global Network.
    - Canadian negotiator Catherine Stewart delivered remarks
    - NAPGN embedded advisor Adrian Fenton spoke. Adrian had prepared the draft NAP framework, which was approved by Fiji's Cabinet.

- **Empowerment for Inclusive Climate Action and Decision-making**

- Co-hosted by IISD and the Government of Grenada
    - The event consisted of two panels, including looking at gender-responsive climate change adaptation

- **Gender Day**

- Network hosted a booth at the Gender Day Marketplace to discuss recent work on gender-responsive NAP processes
    - Network Secretariat staff also organized a dinner for women engaged in gender and climate change work, with a semi-facilitated discussion on advancing gender equality in climate change action. Representatives from Kenya, Uganda and Ethiopia attended.

- **Financing Adaptation: Private Sector Engagement in NAP Processes**

- Hosted by the NAP Global Network at the German Development Institute (DIE) 2017 Interconnections Zone
    - Presentations from representatives from Grenada, Kenya, and Action on Climate Today (who presented on private sector finance for adaptation in India)

- **Strengthening the Impact of Proposals for Accessing Green Climate Fund (GCF) Support for NAPs and/or other Adaptation Planning Processes**

- Co-hosted by the GCF and UNFCCC Secretariat with support from the NAP-Global Support Programme and NAP Global Network.
    - Anne gave a presentation
    - NAPGN financing guidance note was distributed, including French and Spanish translations. Participants noted a lack of non-English resources available on accessing GCF support.

- **How Can Local-to-National Linkages Facilitate Inclusiveness in NAP Processes?**
    - Session co-organized by the NAP Global Network and the Red Cross Red Crescent Climate Centre at Development and Climate Days 2017
    - Highlighted recent work on vertical integration.
    - Presentations from representatives from Ethiopia, Malawi and Action on Climate Today.
- NAP Technical Working Group Meeting
  - Network attended this coordination meeting convened by the LEG
  - NAP Expo to be held April 4-6, 2018, in Bonn
  - This meeting provided an overview of NAP guidance materials, country case studies, trainings and initiatives being undertaken by other NAP support organizations
- Communications lessons and follow-up
  - These items seemed well-received at COP 23; inputs on how to improve them, or on re-adjusting this approach for next year
    - [\*\*Country NAP Process Posters\*\*](#) – we produced country posters looking at NAP processes in Fiji, Jamaica, Ethiopia, Colombia, and Togo.
    - [\*\*NAP Global Network Yearbook 2016-17\*\*](#) – This looks at some highlights from our three activity area and highlights some of the Network's key themes. We'll have 50 print copies with us in Bonn.
    - [\*\*New video to promote the Country Support Hub\*\*](#) – We made this promotional video to encourage Country Support Hub requests. We plan to translate it into French and Spanish in coming months.

### **3. Update on Fiji Targeted Topics Forum**

- Upcoming event is going to be a dual-cohort event featuring the final TTF for Cohort 1 and Cohort 2 convening on M&E
- Making good progress on facilitation and logistics planning.
- Facilitators will be Blane Harvey and Catherine Fischer, given large number of participants
- Cohort 1's Day 1 will focus on communications. Working to confirm resource person from Thomson Reuters. Will look at identifying audiences, developing key messages, and prioritizing communications channels.
- Cohort 1 Day 2 will look to identify key lessons from past TTFs. Questionnaires have gone to participants looking to identify specific topic areas where participants want further. A field visit will follow at the end of Day 2.
- Day 3 will be a Gender Day which will involve participation of both cohorts, including with a number of Pacific island states represented. This day will open with an interactive activity, self-assessment on integrating gender into the NAP, peer-to-peer learning.
  - This session will be led by Angie Dazé and Julie Dekens who have been leading
  - We hope to have a Pacific case study to share
  - Na-Hyeon: Angie and Julie have been meeting with GIZ, as GIZ has recently released guidance on gender and the NAP process. Is there still room to include this guidance into session?
  - Blane: They have been in touch, but there should hopefully be room to highlight this.
  - Na-Hyeon will follow up with Angie and Julie to discuss

- Cohort 2, Day 2 and Day 3 will focus on M&E. Will have Angelica Ospina and Laszlo Pinter from IISD developing the agenda, and Timo Leiter from GIZ is still confirming his participation
- This will be a condensed agenda compared to the previous three-day M&E session, but it looks positive.

***TTF Logistics***

- Signed a contract with the Sheraton-Westin where the event will be hosted

- List of nominations has been requested, and is progressing – nearly all from Cohort 2, and many from Cohort 1.
- IISD now finalizing the official letter of invitation through the Government of Fiji. Once this is signed, we will send it to participants and Management team
- Will be sending out a questionnaire to participants for
- Will be working with the government of Fiji to coordinate a field visit – Cohort 2's will be at the end of their Day 2
- Kari: if any help is needed after invitations have gone out to encourage participants to confirm, US missions can provide assistance
- Christian to keep Blane in the loop on which development partners will be attending for facilitation plan to match country groups with facilitators

**4. Steering Committee**

- Kari: US representative still be confirmed, but supportive of in-person meeting on Feb 10
- Na-Hyeon: GIZ representative still being confirmed. Christof von Stechow has been invited by Kaitlyn. Christian to follow up to confirm availability to participate in-person or remotely.

**5. AOB**

***Communicating Network impacts***

- In preparing BMZ communications materials, it was often challenging: the ministry wanted figures, facts, and more concrete impacts in order to demonstrate NAPGN's impact
- Anne: In addition to regular indicators for donors, we are looking to update the metrics we are tracking, looking at quantifiable results (e.g., how much financing has been leveraged)
- Anne: It would be helpful to receive input from GIZ on specific types of tangible outputs they want
- Na-Hyeon: there is a desire for clear figures (e.g., how many NAP documents have been supported), but also a recognition that NAPGN supports processes
- Anne: we will raise this at the Steering Committee meeting, and will look to make sure that the support that Network provides matches the needs that countries have.

***Country Support Hub updates***

- **Nepal:** We hired a local consultant to help gather information needed to write the document and to provide logistical support. An outline for the synthesis document was already developed and the writing is about to start.

- **Morocco:** Najwa, our local consultant, is holding bilateral meetings with a dozen of donors at the moment, and the Assembly will take place before the end of the year (date not confirmed yet)
- **Albania:** The project is moving forward but with a little delay due to the governmental reforms (reduction of the number of ministries and personnel)
