Why should the private sector be involved in the NAP process? Key engine of economic growth in developing countries:


- 60% of GDP
- 80% of capital flows
- 90% of jobs

Will be needed to:

- Create the jobs needed to support adaptation
- Develop the goods and services needed for societies to become more climate-resilient
- Finance directly or indirectly many adaptation actions



Actors, instruments and scale





- Comply with policies, regulations and investors' interests.





Engaging the private sector in the phases of the NAP process






What can governments do to engage the private sector in the NAP process?

- Generate and communicate climate data and information
- Support research and development for adaptation
- Articulate the business case for adaptation
- Build the capacity to understand and respond to climate vulnerability/risk
- Use the NAP process to communicate the country's mediumto long-term adaptation priorities
- Explore developing a private sector engagement strategy for the NAP
- Understand NAP financing needs early, and develop feasible, bankable project pipelines
- Identify and cultivate private sector champions, and share stories of success and failure to promote crowding-in

Public finance invested to build the capacity of the public sector to engage the private sector


