



NATIONAL ADAPTATION PLAN (NAP) APPROACH:

Enhancing climate resilience to achieve Vision 2030 through economic growth, resilient ecosystems, and sustainable livelihoods.

Kenya's **NAP 2015-2030** builds on the foundation laid out by the **National Climate Change Response Strategy** launched in 2010 and the **National Climate Change Action Plan (NCCAP) 2013-2017**. Led by the Ministry of Environment and Forestry, the NAP process aims to integrate climate change adaptation into national development planning and budgeting; enhance the resilience of public and private sector investments; and enhance synergies between adaptation and mitigation actions to attain a low-carbon, climate-resilient economy.
