Kenya's NAP 2015-2030 builds on the foundation laid out by the National Climate
Change Response Strategy launched in 2010 and the National Climate Change
Action Plan (NCCAP) 2013-2017. Led by the Ministry of Environment and Forestry, the
NAP process aims to integrate climate change adaptation into national development
planning and budgeting; enhance the resilience of public and private sector
investments; and enhance synergies between adaptation and mitigation actions to
attain a low-carbon, climate-resilient economy.


