## NATIONAL ADAPTATION PLAN (NAP) APPROACH:

A participatory, inclusive, gender-responsive approach to adaptation, aligned with the peacebuilding agenda and guided by the best available science and local knowledge.

Led by the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change, the Somali NAP process is guided by a NAP Framework developed in 2021. Currently, the government is implementing the NAP Readiness Project, funded by the Green Climate Fund and implemented with the support of United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), to advance adaptation planning and enhance capacities for climate action.
