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# NATIONAL ADAPTATION PLAN (NAP) APPROACH:

An inclusive, participatory, forward-looking, and systemic approach

As a small island developing state (SIDS) and least developed country (LDC), the Republic of Haiti is extremely vulnerable to the impacts of climate change. Led by the Ministry of the Environment and the Ministry of Planning and External Cooperation, the Republic of Haiti developed its first NAP with support from the Green Climate Fund and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). The NAP has a time horizon of 2022–2030 and financial needs for its implementation are estimated to be a minimum of USD 980 million.
